 - have to qualify by participating in an exchange, be selected, receive government funding

- cannot change status within the U.S.
- are not eligible for an H, K or L visa
- are not eligible for permanent residence in the U.S.

Travel

- Need a valid passport
- F-1/J-1 Visa needs to be valid to enter the U.S.
 - **Exception:**
 - Returning to the U.S. after a trip to Canada, Mexico, or the adjacent islands
 - Trip of less than 30 days
 - Trip solely to Canada, Mexico, or the adjacent islands
 - Cannot apply for U.S. Visa while there
 - Not a citizen of Iran, Syria, Sudan, or North Korea
 - But need to determine if you need a visa to travel to those countries

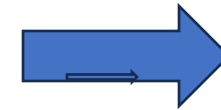
